


The Possible Closure of Danville High School

26 out of 82 HS Students took the survey (31.7%) | 45 out of 47 MS students took the survey (95.7%)










#### **Anti-Closure (Concerns)**


Students worry that closing the high school would take away strong academic opportunities and the close community they value. Many are concerned about losing teacher connections, disrupting credits—especially for seniors—and making graduation harder because other schools require different credits. They mention long bus rides, tougher transportation, and stress for families. Some fear losing friends, extracurriculars, and even local jobs. Overall, they feel closure would hurt community life, learning support, and daily routines.

#### **Pro-Closure (Potential Benefits)**

Students who support or are open to closure think it could offer more school choice and new opportunities in larger schools. They believe some students might find a better fit elsewhere or gain access to more programs.

A prevalent theme throughout these responses (even amongst those expressing pro-closure views) was the sentiment that while they may not all want to stay at Danville (and it may help some), it could also create challenges, especially with transportation and cost for families.

## How do they feel it will impact Danville as a community?



#### **Negative Community Impact (Concerns)**

Students believe closing the high school would harm the town's identity and weaken its sense of community. They worry that local businesses would suffer from losing young customers and that community events—especially school sports and activities—would disappear, reducing opportunities for people to come together. Some mention that the school is the "heart" of the community and fear that closing it would lead to fewer services, including support for students with special needs. They also note potential tax increases and the social strain on kids who would have to start over in new schools.

#### **Positive or Neutral Community Impact**

Some students think the community might adapt. They believe this could happen by shifting focus to new opportunities or by supporting students who will be attending other schools. They suggest the closure could help families who want school choice but can't afford it now. A few believe the community is strong enough to withstand the change or see the situation as a chance to spark important discussion or growth beyond the school.












## Do they agree with the statement "I do not want the HS to close, but feel Danville residents should have a choice"?
